



### OVER THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS.

we've explored an exciting frontier in trip planning: the integration of AI tools into crafting the perfect getaway. With the rise of tools like ChatGPT, Wonderplan AI, Curiosio, Trip Planner AI, AdventureGenie, and Layla, planning an epic journey has become faster, smarter, and in many cases, more personalized. For those of us who love the open road, unique experiences, and teardrop camping adventures, AI tools hold tremendous potential to streamline trip logistics and unlock hidden gems.

Here's a summary of our findings, how these tools can elevate your tiny camper trips, and what's next as we continue to explore this tech-savvy trail.

# The Big Picture: Al in Trip Planning

Al-based tools for trip planning are designed to save time and effort while helping you discover destinations and activities tailored to your preferences. These tools harness massive datasets - ranging from user reviews to geographic information - and apply sophisticated algorithms to provide itinerary suggestions, accommodation options, and recommendations for dining, activities, and scenic routes.

As one of the most versatile tools, ChatGPT stands out for its conversational approach. While it's not purpose-built for trip planning, it proved to be an invaluable brainstorming partner. Whether we were asking for recommendations on scenic routes through the Maritimes or unique campsites in New England, ChatGPT provided detailed

suggestions with flexibility to tweak itineraries on the fly.

**Best for:** Brainstorming trip ideas and creating a starting framework for your adventures.

# Wonderplan Al

Focused on helping users plan multi-day itineraries, Wonderplan AI impressed with its ability to create detailed day-by-day plans. Its interface was user-friendly, and it excelled at grouping activities by proximity, which is a huge advantage when trying to maximize your time in a new area.

**Best for:** Creating efficient, organized plans



when time is limited.

### Curiosio

What set Curiosio apart was its emphasis on unique, off-the-beaten-path recommendations. For adventurers seeking hidden gems rather than tourist hotspots, this AI tool delivered. It also allowed for a more personalized input process, factoring in travel styles and niche preferences.

**Best for:** Adventurers looking for authentic, lesser-known destinations.

### **Trip Planner Al**

This tool catered to those who wanted quick results and a simple user experience. While it lacked some of the depth we found in other tools, it excelled at offering broad, familyfriendly options and suggested destinations that could easily accommodate tiny campers.

**Best for:** Families or beginners looking for nofrills trip planning.

### **AdventureGenie**

For outdoor enthusiasts, AdventureGenie stood out with its focus on camping-related activities. It included campsite reviews, detailed route options, and weather-integrated planning. This was one of the most relevant tools for teardrop and tiny camper enthusiasts, thanks to its focus on road trips and nature-based activities. This makes sense, because it was created by a tech couple after they went on a long RV trip and realized that tools were lacking.

**Best for:** Tiny camper trips that center around camping and outdoor exploration.

### Layla

Layla was the sleekest of the tools we reviewed, offering a polished interface and itinerary suggestions that felt curated and refined. Its integration with booking platforms made it easy to turn a plan into reality without jumping between multiple websites. However, it sometimes leaned more toward luxury and boutique experiences, which might not suit minimalist campers.

**Best for:** Travelers who enjoy blending rugged camping with occasional luxury.

### What We Loved

Each tool brought something unique to the table, but the unifying factor was how they made trip planning feel less daunting. These tools removed the guesswork from logistics, allowing us to focus more on dreaming up the ultimate road trip and less on agonizing over where to stay or what route to take. For tiny campers specifically, AdventureGenie and Curiosio were among our favorites due to their ability to align with the spontaneity and adventurous spirit that tiny camping represents. But even general-purpose tools like ChatGPT and Wonderplan AI offered surprising utility for crafting itineraries that were both practical and imaginative.

### **Room for Improvement**

No tool was without its quirks. Some struggled with integrating camping-specific needs, such as finding remote boondocking spots or accommodating non-traditional lodging preferences. Others excelled in broad planning but lacked the fine-tuning needed for niche travel styles like camping. Additionally, many of these tools still rely

heavily on user input for refining plans - something we expect to see improve as AI becomes more sophisticated.

### What's Next?

As Al technology continues to evolve, we're eager to test updates to these tools and any new entrants to the field. The potential for integrating real-time data - like gas prices, road closures, or campsite availability - could make future iterations game-changing for teardrop campers and adventurers alike.

We also plan to dive deeper into each tool's ability to assist with multi-day trips across varied terrain, as well as evaluate how they handle niche requirements like forest service road navigation or off-grid camping resources.



Additionally, its lightweight design ensures it won't add unnecessary weight to the camper, making it a practical and thoughtful gift for anyone who values preparedness and efficiency while adventuring. I keep one set in the tongue box of the teardrop and one set in the house so I don't forget to take it camping each time.

# Cooler lid light (or small, motion-controlled light)

A cooler lid light or a small motion-controlled light is a fantastic gift for tiny camper owners because it solves the challenge of illuminating tight or dark spaces with minimal effort. These compact lights are incredibly versatile, perfect for brightening up hard-to-reach areas like the back of cabinets, storage compartments,

or the tongue box—places where traditional lighting often falls short. Their motion-sensor functionality ensures they turn on only when needed, conserving battery power and adding convenience, especially during nighttime searches. Easy to install with either screws or adhesive strips, they provide a simple, low-



profile lighting solution that enhances the camping experience. Whether it's finding gear in the dark or adding extra light for safety, these lights are a thoughtful and practical addition to any tiny camper setup. Our tongue box is black and it's often difficult to find what I'm looking for even during the day. We've been using a few of these lights this year and it's made a huge difference.

# **Campfire Starters**

Campfire starters are an excellent gift for tiny camper owners because they take the stress out of building a fire, especially in less-thanideal conditions. Wet wood, damp kindling, or a lack of fire-building expertise can make starting a campfire a frustrating experience, but with reliable fire starters, even novice campers can enjoy a warm and cozy blaze. We've tried using homemade fire starters

from toilet paper tubes stuffed with dryer lint that are then wrapped in wax paper, but we haven't had a lot of success with them. So these tiny fire starters are our go-to's now. On a chilly morning when warmth and hot coffee are a must, campfire starters are a thoughtful and indispensable gift for anyone who loves the great outdoors.

**Cord Organizers** 

Cord organizers make an incredibly thoughtful and practical gift for tiny camper owners because they help keep small spaces tidy and functional. Adjustable organizers for USB cords are ideal for managing phone, tablet, or camera cables, preventing them from tangling or getting misplaced in tight quarters. In a tiny camper, where every inch counts and where your USB charger may not be conveniently located, these organizers keep essentials neatly in place, making it easier to charge devices without clutter. Larger sizes can go beyond tech management, doubling as holders for toothbrushes or even small power cords. Their versatility and spacesaving benefits make them a must-have for any camper looking to maintain order and efficiency on the road.

# Gerber Gear Dime multitool

The Gerber Gear Dime multitool is an ideal gift for tiny camper enthusiasts because it combines portability, functionality, and durability in one compact package. Measuring less than 2 inches long, it's small enough to fit comfortably in a pocket or clip onto a keychain, ensuring it's always within reach. Despite its size, it's packed with essential tools like a knife, scissors, tweezers, and even a bottle opener, making it incredibly versatile for

a wide range of camping tasks. Whether it's cutting rope, opening packaging, removing a splinter, or tackling small repairs, this multitool is a reliable companion for life on the road. I initially bought this multitool to take on a week-long canoe camping trip on the Allagash Wilderness Waterway in Maine. It did get some use while on that trip, like cutting out tags of clothes so they wouldn't rub while



paddling, but it's proven to be extremely useful in my tow vehicle/daily driver. I've used the scissors, box opener, knife and screwdriver quite a bit in the few months I've owned this little tool.

# One-burner Portable Induction Cooktop

A one-burner portable induction cooktop is an innovative and practical gift for tiny camper owners who want a cleaner, more efficient way to cook on the road. Unlike propane stoves, induction cooktops eliminate the need to carry and refill propane, which simplifies planning and removes concerns about running

out of fuel. They also eliminate issues with wind blowing out flames and don't produce exhaust. These cooktops heat up quickly and provide precise temperature control, perfect for boiling water, simmering soups, or frying up a campsite favorite. Compact and lightweight, they fit seamlessly into a camper's limited kitchen space, and when paired with



shore power, a portable battery bank, or the camper's inverter, they become an ecofriendly cooking solution. For campers looking to modernize their setup, this is a gift that combines convenience, safety, and versatility.

We're still experimenting with using our portable induction cooktop and we'll highlight in a future issue our results. We've had a Jackery 1000 for years and to date, we're able to cook several meals on a single charge. This winter we're going to continue our testing to confirm if we can charge our Jackery enough with solar to cook at least two plus meals per charge. It's a completely unscientific study, but with the reduced daylight hours and angle of the sun, it might mimic camping in the upper Midwest, where we often are cloudy or partially shaded.

# **BlendJet Blender**

The BlendJet Blender is a game-changing gift for tiny camper enthusiasts, especially those who love smoothies, shakes, or quick blended meals on the go. Its battery-powered design makes it perfect for boondocking,



where traditional blenders aren't feasible. The USB charging capability ensures it can be recharged using a camper's power bank, solar panel, or vehicle, adding to its convenience. Lightweight and compact, it's easy to store and carry, making it ideal for tiny camper kitchens. Beyond smoothies, it can handle tasks like mixing pancake batter, whipping up sauces, or blending cocktails for a cozy evening under the stars. This portable blender brings a touch of home comfort to off-grid adventures, making healthy, delicious meals a breeze no matter where the road leads. For years, our go-to breakfast has been smoothies with frozen fruit and a protein powder. It's simple, healthy, and can be consumed while driving to work. I used to miss these when we would go camping until I bought a BlendJet.

We can make two per day for several days before it needs to be recharged. It's a fantastic galley tool!

# <u>Lifestraw Home Water</u> Pitcher

The LifeStraw Home Water Pitcher is an outstanding gift for tiny camper owners who prioritize safe and clean drinking water while on the road. Unlike standard water filter pitchers, this one goes the extra



mile by removing bacteria, parasites, and microplastics - essential for those sourcing water from uncertain or non-potable supplies. It also reduces harmful contaminants like lead, mercury, PFAS, chlorine, and pesticides, ensuring peace of mind with every sip.

Compact and stylish, the LifeStraw Home fits seamlessly into a tiny camper setup, providing

a simple and reliable way to enjoy clean water without the need for bulky filtration systems. This is more than just a filter - it's an investment in health, convenience, and sustainability for any camper. Earlier this year, we went on a four week adventure to the Canadian Maritimes. Our dogs don't drink water that's been in either our fresh tank (our teardrop has a sink) or in our plastic jug with a spigot that we fill up at campgrounds. So I purchased this hoping that I could get our dogs to drink water without having to buy gallons of water from a store. It worked! I also appreciated that no matter where we filled up our tanks our drinking water was also crystal clear and had no odor. We have the 7-cup plastic version.

# Tabletop smokeless fire pit

A tabletop smokeless fire pit, like the well known Solo Stove brand, is a fantastic gift for tiny camper enthusiasts who want the ambiance of a campfire without the hassle of



smoke or a full-sized setup. Its compact design makes it easy to transport and store, while its efficient airflow system ensures a nearly smokeless flame, perfect for close quarters or when neighbors are nearby. The versatility of using twigs, small wood chunks, or wood pellets adds convenience, allowing campers to fuel their fire with readily available materials or packable options. It's ideal for creating a cozy atmosphere, roasting marshmallows, or simply enjoying a small, controlled fire that can be quickly extinguished when it's time to pack up. I received the East Oak Brasa Mini Tabletop Fire Pit as a Christmas gift last year. We've used this small fire pit on our front porch as well as while camping. It fits neatly in the included bag and it is compact enough to fit in the tongue box. To make things easier, I bought a 50 pound bag of wood pellets and we use a few plastic cups worth for each fire. We transport the wood pellets in a small plastic container that holds about 5-10 pounds of pellets at a time. If you want to have a fire for an hour or two then this is a good option. If you prefer a roaring campfire for hours, this is not for you. We've never used this on a table, although you can with the provided silicon mat. Our preferred method is to put this on the grate of the existing firepit at a campground. With the price of firewood at or near campgrounds, this mini fire pit will pay for itself in no time! Our 50 pound bag of wood pellets cost us less than \$10USD! https://www.eastoak.com/products/brasamini-tabletop-fire-pit

We always have a set of colored pencils next to our small journal so we're always ready when inspiration hits!

# **12-volt USB outlet**

A 12-volt USB outlet with fast-charging capabilities is a highly practical and thoughtful gift for tiny camper owners looking to upgrade their setup. These outlets are a gamechanger for quickly charging phones, tablets, cameras, and other devices, ensuring campers stay connected and powered during their adventures. The combination of a USB-A and USB-C port offers versatility, accommodating both older and newer devices without the need for multiple adapters. Installing one in a camper allows for efficient use of 12-volt power, making it perfect for off-grid camping or boondocking. The USB-C port is a smart output, meaning it will automatically turn off when the device is charged. It even has enough output to charge a laptop! We changed out one outlet in the teardrop and I'm thinking about putting the other in one of our vehicles too. One of the best features of these outlets is the on/off button that controls the LED light on the outlet. I don't have to put a piece of electrical tape over the lights anymore to keep the interior of the teardrop dark!

# **Propane Tank Y Splitter**

A propane tank Y-splitter is a fantastic gift for those who rely on propane for cooking, heating, or other appliances, like a propane fire pit. This handy tool allows users to connect two devices to a single propane tank simultaneously, providing added convenience and flexibility. Whether it's running a stove and a heater at the same time or powering a grill while keeping a lantern lit, a Y-splitter maximizes the utility of a single propane tank. It's particularly useful for those who want to minimize the hassle of switching connections or carrying multiple tanks. Compact and easy to install, it's a space-efficient addition to any camper's toolkit, offe ring both practicality and enhanced functionality during camping adventures. This tank splitter will not allow gas to escape even if one port is not connected to a propane appliance. Our teardrop has a Propex heater (propane) and a pull-out propane campstove. We only use the heater for winter camping when it's really cold (below freezing or colder). Switching the hose from the cookstove to the heater is less than ideal in cold weather, so I bought this so I could keep both hoses connected at the same time. I've not tried to use the cookstove and heater at the same time, but it's just nice to not have the hassle of swapping hoses when my hands are already freezing! This handy splitter doesn't get a lot of use, but it's well worth the approximate \$18USD.

# **Travel Bidet**

I saw this on a canoe campers YouTube channel and wanted to give it a try. This travel bidet is a unique and thoughtful gift for tiny camper owners, offering a convenient and eco-friendly way to stay clean while on the road. Compact and lightweight, it's easy to pack and takes up minimal space, making it perfect for minimalist campers. Unlike relying solely on toilet paper, a travel bidet provides a gentle, thorough clean that's ideal for those seeking better hygiene, especially during extended trips or when facilities are limited. I love that it helps me use far less toilet paper, which not only reduces waste but also aligns with a more sustainable lifestyle - something I value deeply. Its refillable design allows it to be used anywhere, whether at a remote campsite or a rest stop, ensuring cleanliness



no matter the situation. For campers looking to reduce waste and improve personal care while traveling, this simple tool is a practical and environmentally conscious solution. Best of all, it's inexpensive!

Maintenance is simple, with machine-washable care for hassle-free cleaning, although it can be a challenge to put on and take off in a tiny camper. Whether protecting against pet messes, spills, or outdoor dirt, this mattress protector is a thoughtful and essential addition to any camper setup, offering both functionality and peace of mind.


